The National Auxiliary Publications Service

The American Society for Information Science sponsors a publication service for any auxiliary material—long tables, extensive mathematics, figures, etc.—too long or of too limited interest to be included in a regular Article or Letter. The material is deposited with the National Auxiliary Publications Service by the editor, accompanied by a deposit fee of \$6.50 (to be supplied by the author) for up to 60 pages of manuscript-size paper; 10 microfiche copies are then supplied. The published paper carries a footnote advising the reader of the availability of the additional material and how copies of it may be obtained. Anyone may then order a microfiche copy for \$1.00 or a “hard copy” reproduction for \$3.00 (again, for up to 60 pages).

We strongly recommend the use of this service whenever it seems appropriate.

REMINDER

Rules for Acceptance Without Review

A paper may be accepted for publication without review under the following conditions:

- (1) The subject must be new experimental results in high-energy physics.
- (2) There shall be no more than two figures and no more than two tables.
- (3) The total length, including tables, figures, footnotes, abstract, and the multiple-author byline must be no more than three journal pages. (The key for translating this into typescript pages is that one journal page of running text—no figures—is approximately equivalent to $3\frac{1}{3}$ double-spaced typed pages.)
- (4) The cover letter requesting such treatment must be signed by the department chairman or group leader under whose guidance the work was performed.

All responsibility for originality, validity, and adequate credit to the work of others rests with the authors.
